Wisconsin Search & Rescue Association

A man with Alzheimer's wanders away from home, a hunter or hiker is missing; a berry picker has wandered into unfamiliar territory... Search and rescue is a lifesaving vocation. The ability to save a life is often dependent upon how quickly the person can be found and accessed. Exposure to the elements is the #1 killer for lost subjects. The missing person's survival may rest on timely response from well-equipped, well-trained search and rescue professionals.

This resource manual is designed to provide municipalities and Responsible Authorities with contact information for search & rescue (SAR) groups throughout Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin Search & Rescue Association (WISRA) consists of various volunteer search and rescue teams in the State of Wisconsin and surrounding area. These teams offer different types of search resources including Search Management & Planning, Ground Searchers, and Canines (Air Scouting, Tracking/Trailing, Human Remains Detection).

Resources have been regionalized for efficacy in identifying local resources nearest to the incident. WISRA recommends that each municipality/Public Safety Agency contact their appropriate SAR group and discuss their individual abilities and limitations.

The objective of WISRA teams is to provide a comprehensive and methodological approach in responding to missing and overdue subjects. Our objectives are not to take over the incidents, but instead to provide the Incident Commander/Responsible Authority with suggestions on proper use of search & rescue resources and tactics.

WISRA teams have accreditation thru various nationally accredited organizations such as the National Association for Search & Rescue, American Rescue Dog Association, Law Enforcement Training Systems (LETS) and many others.

The Wisconsin Search and Rescue Association suggests that Responsible Authorities make copies of the following page and use it as a quick reference guide for dispatching the resources.

Wisconsin Search and Rescue Association – Resource Manual

The Wisconsin Search and Rescue Association is made up of independent Search and Rescue teams that make themselves available to any official agency to assist in searches for lost or missing persons in the State of Wisconsin and/or surrounding States.

The Objectives of the Group

- To make available to any official agency trained teams of volunteers that can assist in search and rescue operations.
- To encourage and assist in the formation and training of new search and rescue teams in State of Wisconsin.
- To promote the exchange and dissemination of information and expertise among teams in the State.
- To promote uniformity of search procedures.
- To carry out programs and projects that are of mutual interest and will advance the objectives of the Group.
- To cooperate with other search and rescue organizations and with other rescue disciplines, and to represent the member organization at the local, regional, state, national, and international levels.

Activating The Group

The Group provides for a “call-out” system through which any official agency may obtain Search and Rescue resources. Activation of the Group through your “local” team is encouraged, and the process on Page 4 of this manual should be followed. If a local team cannot be contacted in a timely fashion, utilize the direct Group call-out procedure on Page 4.

Notification with a local team or the Group should be made as early in the search effort as possible.

Due to geography and time, there may be a delay of several hours to obtain “non-local” support. Early notification provides for better response times. Agencies can request that resources be placed on “stand-by” or “immediate response” according to the situation. Early notification will help maximize the turnout of skilled search resources, while minimizing the response time. Appendix A of this manual is a guide to determining the urgency of a particular search situation.

Any questions regarding this procedure can be directed to a Group Officer listed in this manual.

How To Utilize The SAR Volunteer Team

Notify the team closest to the incident for the quickest response. ***We encourage agencies to place us on “stand-by” in the early stages of a search investigation rather than an immediate (and unexpected) call-out in the later stages.*** Members are trained to be self-sufficient and do not require support services during the first hours of a search, but they are always appreciated especially on extended searches. Each team brings different skills (K-9, technical rescue, communications) so ensure that you are asking for the proper resources when a request is made.

Again, your local team can help you to make this determination. Most teams are proficient in basic land search skills, the backbone of every search. Some teams specialize in what they offer: K-9 resources, communications, logistics, ATV’s, and equipment. Searches are very manpower intensive and trained, experienced SAR volunteers can make any search effort more effective and safe. Group resources can be integrated into local resources as “resource enhancers”, to ensure that search tasks are performed in a safe, effective, and standardized fashion.

How to Use This Resource Guide

1. (EMERGENCY)

1. Turn to the map on Page 5
2. On the map, locate the number of the team nearest your locale
3. Using the team number, locate that team's page on pages 9 thru
4. Call the phone number listed under How To Activate on that team's page.

2. (Non-Emergency)

1. Go to page 4 and note the number of the team you are interested in
2. Using the team number, locate that team's page on pages 9 thru
3. Contact one of the individual's listed at the bottom of that page

3. To Contact the Group (EMERGENCY):

1. Follow the procedures at the top of this page

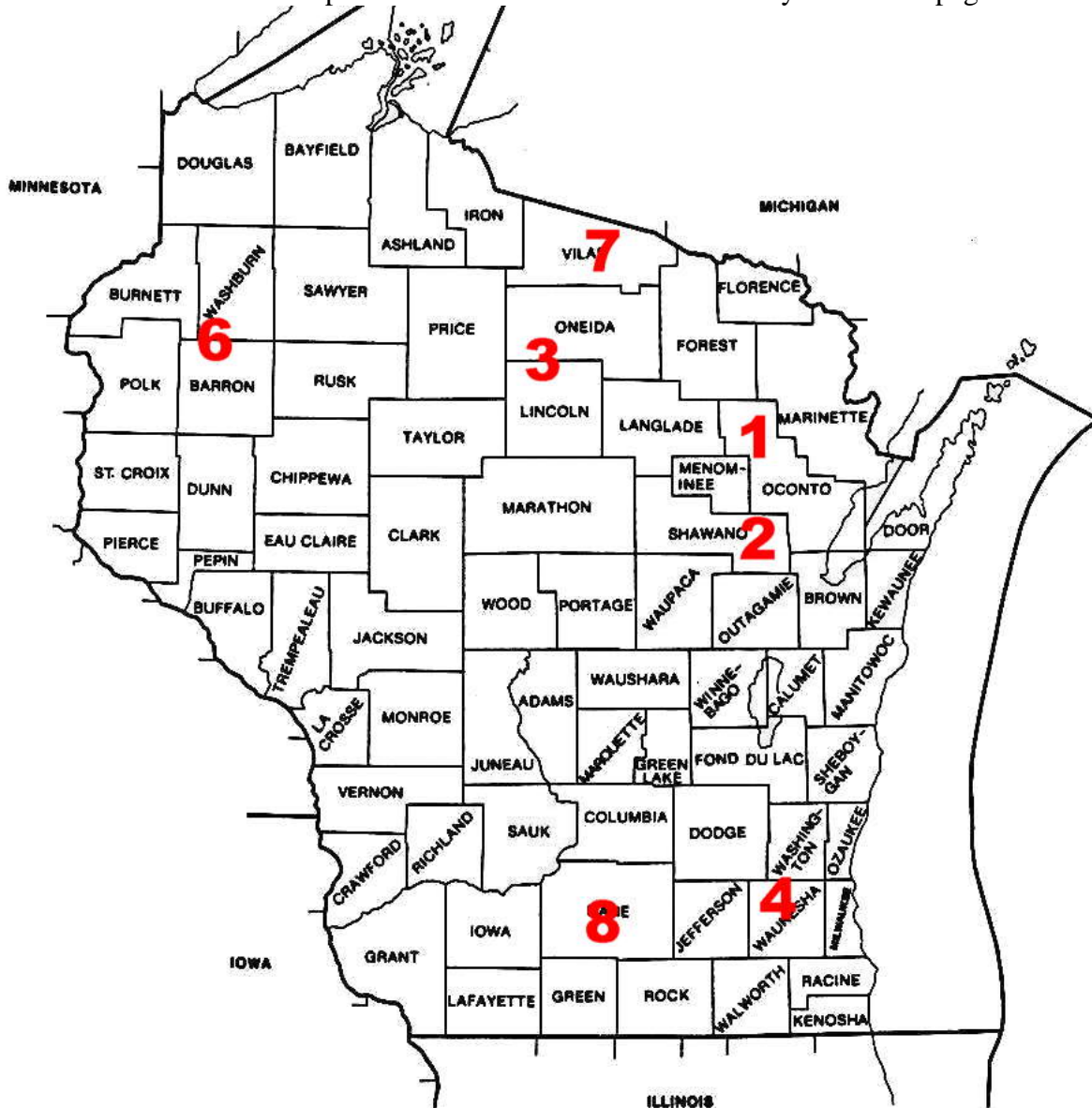
4. To Contact the Group (Non-Emergency):




